ONE WILD OAT (GB) (1991 f. by Shareef Dancer (USA)), placed 3 times at 2 and 3 years; won 1 race in France, £3,776, placed once; dam of 3 winners.

CHOCOLATE BOX (GB) (1995 f. by Most Welcome), won 1 race at 3 years and £5,163 and placed 5 times.
